Support, Community, and Conversation

We offer a range of dedicated sessions designed to support you as a parent and connect you with our community:

- Parent Forums and "Chat with Tania"
 Meetings: These offer bespoke support,
 especially for parents of neurodiverse
 children, focusing on well-being, learning,
 and development for both the child and
 family.
- 'Growing Minds Together': A collaborative session where families celebrate and build on the amazing things you already do with your children every day.

Boost Language with Interactive Reading

Get ready for our exciting new program: Little Voices, Big Talk: the power of picture books to grow conversations!

Research shows that interactive reading is one of the most powerful ways to develop early language. It's not about your child being silent; it's about using the book as a vehicle for back-and-forth interactions and conversation. This approach offers huge benefits for your child's communication, language development, cognitive skills, and strengthens your relationship.

All the above sessions are open to all parents to sign up and book.

Targeted and Specialist Support

We also provide more focused support for families with specific needs:

- 'Connect with Me': Targeted sessions, supported by a range of therapists, to help children with additional needs.
- On-site Speech and Language Therapist: Works directly with children and families needing extra help with communication and language.
- Parenting Support Programmes: Access valuable parenting programmes like Triple P and EPATs through our Children's Centre.

Join Us for Events and Visits

You can also get involved by attending special events throughout the year. These celebrations of special festivals and world events reflect our vibrant and diverse community and help broaden your child's horizons.

Furthermore, you can join us on our educational visits programme, which explores local attractions and travels further afield.

Your Child's Online Learning Journal

Don't forget to regularly check your child's online learning journal! This is a fantastic resource where you can read stories and reports focusing on your child's interests, learning, development, progress, and achievements at the Nursery.

Outside play

We have enjoyed a variety of weather this term. Please dress your child to match the weather: warm coats, hats and gloves for the cold weather and raincoats and wellington boots for rainy days. Please make sure your child is wearing closed toed shoes with good grip to support and protect their feet when climbing and running in the garden.

We are lucky enough to have beautiful garden spaces and spend much of our time outdoors in all weather. The children bring much joy to the outdoors come rain or shine. we see our gardens as other classrooms providing rich learning opportunities and we know spending time outdoors really supports children's well-being, health and education. Our curriculum for nature enhances our outdoor learning experiences.

Inclusive setting

We are an inclusive setting working with all children at all stages of development. We build on children's achievements and plan next steps based on what children can do, moving all children forward in their learning and development.

Prams/buggies and scooters

Please leave prams, buggies and scooters under the shelter whilst you take your child into the garden. A member of staff is always on the gate and happy to look after younger siblings in their prams whilst you help your child to register. Only scooters and children's bikes may be left under the shelter during the session. Please take prams and buggies home as we have very limited space.
